



For 1982/83 the National Executive hasn't changed very much, however AUSSI has a new National Secretary, the current NSW State Secretary, Brian Hird has taken this office. At this stage one must thank Ann Still for the work load she carried from September '81 to April '82. The popular Peter Jackson is once again President and the ever reliable Mary Connolly, Treasurer. Des McCormick heads Fitness and Coaching and Carol Davis continues with AAS.

As I mentioned in the last two AAS magazines I was impatient to see the results of the WA Review — "AUSSI Where are we Heading?" I was not disappointed, the work put into this 80-odd-page publication was tremendous. When I explain that after 4 hours reading I still felt there were many areas I had to read again and reasses, you will realise that the review will assist those holding office for many years. I urge each State to make a detailed study of the recommendations and report back on their findings to the National Executive.

The National Office will continue on a shared basis with the NSW Branch Office — hopefully always helpful and pleasant will be Mesdames Evelyn Street and Carol Davis at (02) 521-8636 — P.O. Box 456, Sutherland.

I reiterate that AAS is not only a news sheet, I hope all members will use it as a means of sharing ideas and experiences, very little is ever rejected—so keep those letters and articles coming in.

The highlight of the AUSSI year is always the National Swim, certainly not everyone can attend for various reasons, and not all our members wish to attend, because competition is not what they want from AUSSI. However, for those who do, I believe they find the National Swim has an atmosphere of its own. This year 557 entries were received. There were 2,285 in-

dividual races in which 77 new Australian Records were set, 34 by the women, 43 by the men. Congratulations to the outstanding swimmers of the Meet, Richard Campion (41) of Power Points, Victoria and Jim Williams (50) of Tamworth NSW, 5 new National Records each and Alva Wyatt (40) of Baddaginnie, Victoria who kept the ladies' flag flying with 4 new National Records.

The six relay events saw 231 teams participate, and if there was some shyness in cheering on the individual, then it disappeared once "the team" was in the water, in fact during the medley relay one lady was so carried away that she was seen running alongside the pool, arms breatstroking furiously while calling to her teammate "swim, Swim, SWIM".

The National Executive would like to congratulate NSW for the great job they did in hosting the National Swim, the Sydney clubs did a fine job of officiating. Four people who worked long and hard, yet are not members of AUSSI were Jack Macklin (starter) and Alf Sparkes (referee) from the NSW ASA and the chief recorder/results and assistant, Audrey Stutsel and Jean Williams, who as Peter Jackson put it, just happened to be married to AUSSI members.

With the big AUSSI carnivals turning into 3 and 4 day marathons now, it is becoming increasingly difficult to find sympathetic friends to take the kids over such a long period, and the lack of childminding facilities must deter a lot of young mums and dads from competing at all. Three days of keeping a bored toddler quiet or out of the pool isn't much fun!

Dear Pat.

I'm sure your letter will strike a cord with many of our readers. Evelyn rang Child Welfare, The Department of Youth and Community Services. They told us it would be possible to organise a creche or child minding because it would be viewed as occasional care, as the Meets are conducted over a limited period.

There are several ways of doing this, you can organise friends of swimmers to do the child minding at an agreed rate i.e. no union rates of pay involved, however, parents would have to sign a form stating that they took full responsibility for the child/children and that they would not be leaving the premises. In other words "all care taken, but no responsibility".

Or you can have trained staff on union rates, the rates depend on qualifications, i.e. babies require nursing qualifications. Child Welfare suggest that area should be 35 sq. ft. per child and a ratio of 1 adult for every 5 children as reasonable requirements. They also said equipment to amuse the children would have to be looked into.

Again Child Welfare said they would be happy to help if we wished to set up a creche or child minding centre for our next National Swim (don't forget there are small differences with

Two ACT Branch members recently attended a course arranged by the Centre for Continuing Education at ANU entitled "The Science of Fitness". I thought other AUSSI members may be interested in the content of the course, and I'm including a brief resume.

The course ran for one session on Friday night and three sessions on Saturday. It began with a lecture by Dr Frank Pyke of the Canberra CAE followed by question time. Topics covered included-

1. The Case for being Physically Fit

* Improve physical performance/productivity

Control body weight

Lessen chance of cardio-vascular disease

* Improve sense of well-being

2. Understanding Physical Fitness

- * What is meant by being physically fit
- * Basic components of fitness
 - Aerobic fitness
 - Muscular fitness
- * Basic body structure
- * Benefits of vigorous exercise

3. Measuring Physical Fitness

- * Body composition
- Lung function
- * Cardio-vascular endurance
- Muscular strength/endurance
- * Flexibility
- 4. Factors in Exercise Prescription
- * intensity, duration, frequency, type

5. Factors in Exercise Adherence

- * Family support
- Availability of facilities
- * Knowledge of Whys and Hows
- * Enjoyment and Variety
- * Competent leadership* Group camaraderie
- * Freedom from injury
- Periodic testing

Although this was a general course, point 5 especially is very relevant to our Club structure.

On Saturday morning each participant was scientifically tested at the Sport Studies Laboratory at the Canberra CAE. Physical characteristics (age, height, weight, total skinfold and percentage fat), blood pressure, lung func-



tion, cardo-vascular endurance and flexibility were tested.

The afternoon session was held at a local health studio. The results of the morning's tests were discussed and put in perspective. We were then shown over the studio, evaluation of members and fitness programming was explained, and the equipment was demonstrated. The group then participated in a one hour Jazznastics session followed by a swim and spa.

The evening session was shared between Alan Hahn, an expert on muscles and exercising and Janet Pyke. Dr Hahn discussed:

1. Further Consideration in Exercise Programming

- Danger exercises
- * Overuse injuries
- * Heat illness
- * Asthma
- Female considerations

Janet Pyke spoke on:

2. Nutrition, Weight Control and Exercise

- * Basics of Nutrition
- * Caloric value of foods
- * Caloric expenditure of exercise
- * Obesity
- * Role of exercise in weight control

There was such a wealth of information and such a short time available that we are hoping to draw on the expertise of the above people for future coaching seminars. The section on danger exercises I found extremely relevant and could expand on this in another issue, if there is any interest.


Dear Beth.

Open Letter to Masters Swimmers

Dear Fellow Aquaticians:

Regretfully I must bid farewell to all of you as a competitor. However, you may see me at some of the Regional and National meets in a different role. Those of you who were at Canton, OH last summer may already be aware of this. I hope to dutifully continue this privilege.

Some of you may already know that I suffered a heart attack in the 5th Region 11 Masters Championships near Baltimore on the 28th February, 1982. From this day forward I will support the gracious host team, Maryland Masters, my team, in a variety of noncompetitive roles.

Our founder, Ransom Arthur, has told us

"that we cannot absolutely guarantee that continued physical fitness through heavy exercise will protect you against all heart attacks." Until 28 February, this seemed to be to be an invincible shield of immunity. But now, this 'my' umbrella of protection, has been shattered.

I believe that we owe Ransom Arthur infinite thanks. 10 years of glory, 10 national championships and one (1) national title should be enough for anyone! Verily I will miss competition, but I agree with my cardiologist that the risk to continue would be perilous. In lieu of this however, I

will just swim for the fun of it.

In parting I would not recommend that you work out on your own as I had been doing since 1979. Unless you are a professional coach or M.D., you might work yourself into an overly stressful situation. Taking L.S. and W.S. I. concurrently and trying to maintain a level of 75% combat readiness may have been the deciding factor.

I further recommend that all 40 plus year olds have a semi-annual check up and ease off a bit on repeat 50's and 100's. I shall see you again dear friends but 'until we meet once more, here's wishing you a happy voyage home'.




It was obvious to all State delegates who received a copy of the report called "Where are we At" "Where are we Going", that WA had put a lot of time and research into producing this report.


I urge all States to get behind WA and study their report, then come back with answers to their recommendations by the next National Council Meeting to be held in Adelaide at the end of July, 1982.

NEW SOUTH WALES

The 1982 National Swim and Australian Club Championships incorporating the NSW State Cup ran like clock work, considering there were sixteen events with no less than 384 heats. The greatest number of entries were in the 50 metre Freestyle, this event had 53 heats.

All officials are to be commended on the effort and hard work put into making the championships the success they were.

From marshall Des McCormick to starter Jack Macklin, referee Alf Sparkes through to timekeepers, then to recorders, with a team like this how could we go wrong.

The two top teams of the carnival, Ettalong and Coogee/Randwick combined together to make the welcome barbecue a night to remember.

Ettalong were responsible for the raising of funds, and Coogee/Randwick the catering. Both clubs did an excellent job.

I could go on forever praising the different people, and clubs, who had a hand in the organisation of this memorable occasion, so I will cut it short and will just mention two gentlemen in particular. Alf Sparkes referee, and Jack Macklin starter. These two men, not members of AUSSI, worked through Friday (9 hours) non stop without a break, continued Saturday all day and Sunday morning on a voluntary basis, our sincere thanks to these two on a job well done.

I would like to point out that there were 556 individual swimmers entered this year, which is an increase on last year of 92, and 50 clubs increase of 8 clubs. This argues well for the future of AUSSI Masters Swimming in Australia.

There were many records broken at the recent National Swim and some of them were NSW records. To my knowledge there is no such thing as a NSW record. Let's make it official, after all Paul Wyatt of Coogee/Randwick spent hours prior to the Nationals, researching and recording these times, congratulations Paul.

At the time of writing we have held two council of Club meetings in country areas one at

Armidale and the other at Ettalong, both meetings ran successfully. The next country meeting will be held at Tamworth. Followed by a city meeting, then the AGM on September 18th. Let's have a good role up at this AGM, our intention is to hold it at the State Office at Sutherland in the morning prior to the Cronulla/Sutherland Swim.

The Cronulla/Sutherland Swim will be the first Pelican Trophy event in the 1982/1983 season. Speaking of the Pelican Trophy at the conclusion of the State Cup Coogee/Randwick holds the lead on 5 points followed by Ettalong 7 points, Cronulla/Sutherland 10 points and North Sydney on 13 points. I will keep Club Secretaries informed on the progressive points of the Pelican Trophy with a newsletter with each copy of the State Council of Clubs minutes.

Another new date to add to your calendar is the 21st November 1982. Muswellbrook are holding their first carnival, they intend to hold it Sunday so teams from Sydney can travel up on Saturday and have a fresh start on Sunday around 10am to 11am. Information will be forwarded to all clubs.

Notice to Advertisers

The Trade Practices Act 1974, most of which came into operation on 1st October, 1974, imposes an obligation on advertisers, individuals involved in the preparation of advertisements, persons whose business it is to publish or arrange for the publication of advertisements and persons who display advertisements prepared by others to ensure that advertisements do not contravene the prohibitions contained in the Act.

The prohibitions against misleading or deceptive conduct and certain other specified conduct in advertising are contained in various sections of the Act, some of which are as follows:

Section 52 of the Act provides in effect that no person or incorporated body whether within or in some cases outside Australia shall engage in conduct that is misleading or deceptive, in trade or commerce.

Section 53 of the Act provides in effect that it shall be a criminal offence for a person or incorporated body whether within or, in some cases, outside Australia, in trade or commerce in connexion with the actual or possible supply of goods or services or in connexion with the promotion by any means of the supply or use of goods or services—

- "(a) falsely represent that goods or services are of a particular standard, quality or grade or that goods are of a particular style or model;
- (b) falsely represent that goods are new;
- (c) represent that goods or services have sponsorship, approval, performance characteristics, accessories, uses or benefits they do not have;
- (d) represent that the corporation has a sponsorship, approval or affiliation it does not have;
- make false or misleading statements concerning the existence of, or amounts of, price reductions;
- make false or misleading statements concerning the need for any goods, services, replacements or repairs; or
- (g) make false or misleading statements concerning the existence or effect of any Warranty or guarantee."

The penalties provided for breach of this section are, in the case of a person, a fine of \$10,000 or 6 months' imprisonment, and in the case of an incorporated body by a fine of \$50,000. Additionally the court may grant an injunction restraining a person from engaging in conduct that constitutes a contravention of the Act. A person who suffers loss or damage as a result of a contravention of the Act may recover the amount of the loss or damage by action against that person.

Section 54 of the Act prohibits the offering of gifts, prizes or other free items with the intention of not providing them as offered.

By Section 55 of the Act a person or incorporated body whether within or in some cases outside Australia in trade or commerce shall not engage in conduct that is liable to mislead the public as to the nature, the manufacturing process, the characteristics, the suitability for their purpose or the quantity of any goods.

By Section 56 of the Act there is a prohibition against "bait advertising" or advertising goods or services at a special price not intended to offer for supply at that price.

By Section 57 of the Act the practice of referral selling is prohibited.

By Section 58 of the Act the practice of accepting payment without intending to supply goods or services rendered is prohibited.

By Section 59 of the Act the making of false or misleading statements concerning profitability or risk or any other material aspect of any business activity is prohibited.

In addition to these sections, attention is drawn to the provisions of Sections 62 and 63 regarding product safety standards and produce information standards.

In addition to the penalties outlined, the court may make such other orders as it thinks fit to redress injury to persons caused by contravention of the Act. These other orders include, but are not limited to, an order:

- (a) declaring the whole or any part of a contract void;
- (b) varying a contract;



- (c) directing the refund of money;
- (d) directing the payment to persons who have suffered loss or damage of the amount of the loss or damage.

It is clearly impossible for us to ensure that all advertisements published strictly comply with the provisions of the Act. We will, however, take what action is available to us in this regard by carefully scrutinising all advertising material presented to us for publication. Advertisers and individuals involved in the preparation of advertisements must bear the prime responsibility for ensuring that advertisements do not contravene the prohibitions contained in the Act.

As a general rule advertisers should, in order to avoid contraventions of the prohibitions, make their advertisements informative and ensure that claims made are capable of substantiation. Where doubts exist it may be in your interest to seek legal advice prior to submitting advertisements for publication.







A TRIBUTE TO FITZ LOUGH

Fitz Lough was one of the most remarkable characters I have ever met. He was a sportsman, a lay preacher, a deep thinker, a patriot, an eccentric and in some respects a loner for he remained a bachelor.

My association with Fitz dates back over some fifty years and for the last forty of these I became a close associate of his as we discussed varying topics such as sport in general, swimming in par-

ticular, politics, finance, religion and just about anything controversial.

I was introduced to swimming at the old Manly tidal baths (now non-existent after being demolished by a gale in May, 1974) back in the late 1920s and as my father knew Fitz as a boy, Fitz in turn came to know me as a lad.

As a youngster I marvelled at his strong build, his beautifully muscled body, his abounding



energy, his love of life, his friendliness and his willingness to advise young swimmers.

In those days it was considered bad to train in the early morning but Fitz refuted this, claiming that race horses trained at dawn so humans could do the same thing.

Maybe his reasoning was paradoxical but nevertheless his early morning swims kept him in such condition that nobody in his age group could even then hope to compete with him.

In my early twenties I decided Fitz's theory of pre-breakfast swimming had something to it and so I joined him at the old baths where our training times coincided each morning and continued until the pool was demolished.

At much the same time the bath manager's son, a teenager called Frank O'Neill joined us and with Fitz's encouragement he became an Australian champion and Olympic representative.

Fitz's sporting achievements over the years must be unparalleled since they commenced before I was born and as accurate records are difficult to locate, word of mouth from old time locals must be relied upon.

However there is no doubt that at the Surf Life Saving Association's first Australian Championship Carnival held at Bondi Beach in March, 1920, Fitz did in fact win the open belt title then known as the alarm reel event.

Legend has it that Fitz who was a great exponent of running underwater dived under a wave and emerged a few minutes later almost at the buoys leaving his opponents wallowing in the white broken water.

During the 1920s he was a member of the Manly Life Saving Club's R & R team which captured the Australian honours.

When the A.I.F. swimming championships were first organised in the 1930s, Fitz won the 100m freestyle beating his fellow clubmate and former Olympian Harry Hay.

To demonstrate his versatility he won the open golf championship at the Long Reef Club in 1923 and in the same era played first grade football for the Manly Rugby Union Club.

Fitz was one of these freaks who excelled at any sport which he undertook.

Even in recent years he was the billiards and snooker champion of the Manly Civic Club and in my youth I can recall that he was absolutely unbeatable at table tennis.

I clearly remember the late Harold "Rastus"

Evans, legendary surfboat sweep of the Surf Life Saving Association, relating at the North Steyne Surf Club of which, naturally, Fitz was the boxing champion, how some of the members learnt that Fitz was going to play croquet one particular day. Regarding croquet as a sport for old ladies they thought this would be a great opportunity to go along and poke fun at him.

However their jeers soon turned to cheers at the dexterity displayed by Fitz only to learn that he, completely unknown to them, was also a champion at this game.

Hearsay has it that Fitz's father, a physical fitness fanatic, left him a set of lawn bowls and needless to relate when Fitz took up this sport after a short period he became the club champion at that too!

Fitz was a deeply religious man, a staunch christian who became a lay preacher after graduating with first class honours from Sydney University in the course apertaining to that branch of divinity.

I can personally recall discussing various religious topics at our old "Rendezvous", the Manly baths, and how Fitz used to discuss



theological theories with the local Catholic monsignor, Father McDonald, also a regular swimmer at the old pool.

It was Fitz's deeply-religious convictions that possibly robbed him of further world records at our Pan Pacific swim meet last September because he would not compete on Sundays.

Fitz was a true patriot. The walls of his home on the harbour front at Manly are decorated with pictures of past British Kings and the present Queen.

Fitz enlisted in the army in World War I and tried to enlist with the Australian Armed Corps in World War II but due to his age and a damaged knee (a legacy of sport) he was rejected.

Undaunted, in 1940 Fitz set sail for London to enlist in the English Army but was again turned down.

Whilst there he survived the "Battle of Britain" being bombed in both London and Liverpool.

Disillusioned with this further rejection he set sail for Australia only to be torpedoed in the Atlantic Ocean.

English newspapers recorded how Fitz ushered fellow travellers behind the funnels as German planes straffed the decks and the bravery he displayed in launching the life boats and assisting in the rescue of fellow passengers as the ship sank.

Fitz was a deep thinker and nothing gave him more delight than to solve mathematical problems.

Whilst not having had a tertiary education nor probably much of a secondary education in mathematics, he was virtually self taught and right up to his death he had an extraordinary interest in the subject. As an engineering University academic I can recall a particular problem he derived about a speed boat performing on a river the answer of which resolved into the solution of a set of complex algebraic equations that brought our school to a standstill as I and my colleagues puzzled over the answer.

Claiming that this particular problem was causing him many sleepless nights, Fitz's mathematical curiosity was not satisfied until he was presented with a complete solution to this "mind-boggler".

Fitz also had a great sense of humour. He and Bill Lough, the former president of AUSSI pretended to be father and son. Fitz carried this prank to his grave for upon his death Bill Lough received many messages of sympathy.

Fitz was both eccentric and fearless. He would not permit cigarette smoking in his house yet on festive occasions he would smoke a cigar and then eat the ash!!

He would not eat an egg because he once saw a hen lay one!

Bright sunny, hot, summer days were described as terrible weather because in later life he hated to expose his body to the sun, although as a youth I believe he lazed about the beach as a typical sun bronzed life saver.

He hated jelly fish and many times I have seen him stamp out of the old baths because of their presence.

And yet he had no fear or sharks for I personally saw him dive over the side of the Manly Baths and swim some quarter of a mile across to the Manly ferry wharf and back because something displeased him within the pool. On his 65th birthday he swam alone from Manly to Queenscliff and back, a distance of two miles in the open surf.

His fearlessness is legendary.

He used to ride a bicycle off a ten metre platform at Manly Swimming Club's carnivals in the 1920s, whilst I believe a precipitous part of one of the ski runs at Kosciusko is to this day known as "Lough's Leap" because of his daredevil jump when the snowfields were being developed.

He was a champion fisherman, jokingly claiming that he understood the "language of bream" and that he had a secret bait which they could not resist.

I clearly remember the Christmas day he fished off the Manly baths and presented each senior heat winner of the Manly Swimming Club (and there were some eight heats) with a live bream caught during the progress of each 50m dash.

Despite his religious convictions Fitz was not a "wowser" for he liked a little gamble whether it be on the stock exchange, the race horses or even a dollar or two in the poker machines.

It is known that he was a shrewd investor as was evidenced by his comfortable style of living during his long retirement.

Each night before dinner within the confines of his own home he enjoyed a whiskey or two followed by a bottle of his favourite beer.

I feel that although Fitz considered this as excessive, my almost daily observation of him

never in the slightest way suggested that he overindulged but more likely his moderate intake of alcohol contributed to his longevity.

All members of AUSSI will recall Fitz's great swimming record since our inception and without results at my side I would believingly state that he was never beaten in his age division in any style over any distance. His farewell performance of world age records in the 200m and

400m freestyle last year at our Pan Pacific meet stand as clear evidence that at the age of 84 years he was a true and worthy world champion.

Although I mourn the death of a lifelong friend I am pleased that when death came it overtook him quickly for a man of Fitz's calibre just could not tolerate being an invalid.

As for myself, I feel that my life has been just so much richer in knowing Fitz Lough.




