

The AUSSI annual general and ordinary general meetings were held during the two days immediately after the open water swim and the formal business was completed in good time on the first day. The election of David Cummins and Craig Smith to the new National Board of Management was confirmed and this body has already listed some policy issues to deal with.

Two interesting sessions were held on the second day. In the first of these Paul Watmough demonstrated the main features of the new membership database and answered questions and settled some anxieties. There is adequate training for the people who must use it and it should be operating smoothly fairly soon.

Geoff Stokes, past chair of the English masters committee, spoke in the second session. He explained how Masters Swimming is organised in his country through 'age group' clubs (there are only one or



two purely masters clubs). His analysis of the merits of the English and Australian set ups was insightful. It seems that our system has many advantages in being independent of Swimming Australia.

There are other events that our swimmers and branches will be interested in such as the Central Australian Masters Games in Alice Springs, the Pan Pacs in Queensland, the next National Swim in Queensland, the Australian Masters Games in Geelong and the World Masters Games in Sydney. There is plenty of competition for all of you who like competing.

XII FINA WORLD MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS 2008

It seems only yesterday we were all talking about the excitement of the forthcoming 2008 FINA World Masters Championships and now it is over a month since this great event finished.

There are many ways of assessing the success of an event, and there are several hallmarks that we in Western Australia believe made the "Worlds" such a special event:

 The rich diversity of participants, about 3,800 swimmers and a total of 4,800 competitors in the four disciplines, from 74 countries, with some absolutely amazing swims.

- Lots of stories from visiting swimmers who loved Perth and had seen other parts of Western Australia or were going to do so after the event which equated to great tourism value.
- The feedback from swimmers was overwhelmingly positive from both local and overseas participants. Fundamental comments as the event was "for the swimmers".
- There was strong participation by our local

swimmers and many terrific stories from our clubs about the way the event has generated wonderful camaraderie among swimmers and volunteers (many of whom did both).

The Western Australia Board was not only keen to ensure a successful event, it also set a goal to maximise the legacy of the Championships. We saw two opportunities.

The first was financial as we will receive a fee for the organisation and running of the

event, and after costs have been finalised, significant funds and feedback from many will be available for the benefit of current and future members.

The second was increased major event expertise. We knew we had a core of talented people experienced in running major events, but we wanted to build on that for the future. We exceeded our expectations at all levels, such as Organising Committee, Meet Director, pool Masters Swimming. Due to the deck officials, recording, recruiting and managing volunteers - the list goes on.

In fact based on observations swimmers, the professionalism and positive attitude of our volunteers, often under considerable pressure, was fantastic and a key reason why the event was so enjoyable and successful for the swimmers.

And another legacy has emerged - the increased community awareness of media coverage, the many conversations we all had with friends, family and others, so many people now know about Masters Swimming. So the

WHY WAS I DISQUALIFIED?

Generally, a Referees will try to tell you that you have been disqualified and why immediately after the event. However, this is not always possible for a number of reasons. For example, there may not be enough officials to provide back-up while the Referee advises the you that you were disqualified or it may not be possible to delay the flow of the swim meet due time constraints.

As a result you may not find out you have been disqualified until you look at the preliminary results. These results should show a disqualification code next to your name, such as "GA", which is the code for a false start. AUSSI has a code for every rule infraction and there should be a list of these codes posted next to the results to help you decipher the code next to your name.

If you have been disqualified and there is no code or there is a code but you feel that you didn't do what the code says, ALWAYS go and ask the Meet Referee (whose name will be in the program) what it was that you did. There are several possibilities that could result in your disqualification being reversed.

You may have a Medical Disability Form, registered for events conducted under AUSSI Masters Rules, that indicates you are unable to perform certain movements due to an internal medical condition (e.g. a hip injury) and this may not have been registered in the Meet software. There may have been a processing error that resulted in a disqualification being recorded to the wrong swimmer, for example

the heat or lane numbers may have been transposed. This can be picked up by the Meet Referee asking the Recorders to produce the Infraction Report Form and speaking to the Officials who signed the report.

If neither of these situations apply and you believe you did not commit the rule infraction then you should register a protest with the Meet Referee. In conducting a review of the incident the Meet Referee must reverse your disqualification if there was any doubt as to what they saw, on the part of the official who reported the infraction. Where there is no doubt and the Meet Referee agrees with the decision of the Referee for your event (the Event Referee) your protest will be rejected. Don't feel dejected if you were disqualified because you now know why and with a little work on your part you won't make the same mistake again

If you wish to know more about the Protest Procedure go the the National website www.mastersswimming.org.au, click on "Rules & Regulations" and then on "General Rules". The relevant rule is GR 6.15. If you are not sure about how any rule applies to you ask one of your friendly AUSSI Masters Referees.



TRUE AUSSI FRIENDSHIP

Jennie Bucknell (Powerpoints) and Vicky Watson (Ryde AUSSI Masters) first came to know each other by name in 2007. Where did they meet? On the AUSSI Masters Swimming Records List. They were regularly breaking each other's records in the 50m Freestyle and 50m Butterfly in the 40-44 year age group.

Earlier this year, Vicky and Jennie made contact with each other by email. They corresponded a few times before they met at the recent World Championships in Perth. They were destined to meet at the Championships, as they were seeded in the same heats for their favourite events.

When the pair first corresponded, Jennie told Vicky that she had looked up some of her results from recent years and found that she previously swam in England and had swum in previous World Champs. Little did she know that Vicky's 2007 achievements were a testament to Vicky's determination. Within a



month of finishing intensive chemotherapy for breast cancer, Vicky broke two records at the first meet in which she participated. These records had stood for nearly 10 years. She finished the year by breaking the 50m Butterfly record in Olympic Trials qualifying time.

Whilst in Perth, Jennie learnt about Vicky's illness and what she had achieved in such a short time since she completed her chemotherapy.

It was then that Jennie showed a true gesture of AUSSI friendship. Jennie gave the individual gold medal she won at the World Championships to Vicky as a gift. This was a memorable swim for Jennie as she broke Shane Gould's 100 freestyle record in an incredible time.

No doubt their friendship and rivalry will continue for many years to come.

National Registration Database Update

The priority of the IT
Committee during 2008 has
been to source a replacement
National Registration
Database to provides for all
the needs of Masters
Swimming Australia and its
Branches.

At the Annual General Meeting in April, the Branch delegates agreed to engage IMG ecommerce to

develop a new database for Masters Swimming Australia using their "Clubs-on-Line" (www.clubsonline.com.a u) membership, subscription management and event registration system.

This Online system will make it easier for members to update their membership details, renew their membership, purchase merchandise or enter meets and events as a competitor or volunteer. Clubs-on-Line was built on the premise of being simple to use, requiring no special software or computer skills.

Clubs-On-Line offers:

- A tiered membership solution that caters for National Organisation's with Branches and Clubs, such as Masters Swimming Australia.
- On-line event registration and management, which enables members to selfregister for meets and integrates with Meet Manager software.
- On-line subscription management and payment processing, reducing

accounting processes & management at the Club, Branch and National level.

A major benefit of this system is that members can register, make payments and update their own information on-line through the membership portal, thus reducing the administration required by Club Registrars, with the peace of mind that the security and privacy of payments and data is being protected. This is achieved by each member registering on-line being issued with a unique user ID and password.

However, there is still a choice for the member. For the less Internet savvy, those that don't have access to a computer or those without the facilities to make on-line payments, members are still

able to register through the usual paper-based manner and make cash payments directly to the club as they have done in the past. In this case the club registrar will update the database manually.

This membership solution allows for the storage and maintenance of all of Masters Swimming Australia's member information, providing administrators with the ability to categorise and organise members into user definable types and groups. These allocations can then be used for communication and reporting purposes at all levels within the organisation.

The implementation process commenced with a training session on May 22 in Melbourne at IMG Headquarters for Branch Administrators and Registrars. Club Registrars should have received by now instructions on how to log into the test database and have a "play" with the system prior to it going "live" with current membership data. If you have

not received this information as yet, please contract your Branch Administrator/ Secretary.

We are currently in the process of validating data loading from the old SwimNet database to the new system and ensuring that we properly capture those swimmers who have registered since the demise of the SwimNet database. Once this phase is complete, we will move on to individual club training. This will be undertaken via a series of 'webinars', which are online sessions where participants using their home PC, will be walked through the various components of the system by a human instructor. Participants will also be connected to the telephone at the same time and therefore can ask questions and hear questions that others are asking. These webinars can cater for fifteen participants at a time.

Other exciting add-ons are available through Clubs-on-Line and will be rolled out in the future based on the needs of our Clubs and Branches. These include:

- Content management websites that are easy to use and customisable, which are optional for clubs to utilise if they wish (at no additional cost); and
- On-line shop with full sales analysis facilities and reporting, which Clubs and Branches can make use of if they wish to sell their merchandise, reducing the workload of club merchandising officers.

However, at present, we are currently concentrating on having a great workable database independent of any other sporting organisation, but tried and proven by many. Further details regarding the roll out strategy will be available shortly via the Masters Swimming Australia website.

The Victorian Branch will be running two Officials workshops in July, one for



forward to future successes.


General Rules of Competition


