Lynette grew up in Bondi swimming at the Bondi Baths.

She trained as a Physical Education Teacher working mostly in the Parramatta area.

As a teenager, Lynette was coached by Pam Hutchings (who won the NSW and Australian Masters athlete of the year, twice) and it was pam who inspired her to return to swimming as an adult in 2003. Lynette was nominated for the NSW Masters Athlete of the year in 2006.

She was newsletter editor for her club Blacktown and was awarded Club Person of the Year for 2005.

Lynette played water polo and competed at a national level until she retired in her early 20s.

Lynette joined Blacktown and within 18 months she was breaking records in the 55-59 age group.
